This stoneware pottery is microwave, dishwasher and oven safe. It is sturdy, food safe and lead free. Glaze colors available:

Please Note: Insides of vessels (mugs and lidded items) may be glazed with clear or white glaze.

Items marked with \* can be customized with wording or simple drawings for an additional fee. Measurements and shapes will vary within 5% or so due to being handmade. Glazes and shape will not be 100% uniform from item to item for the same reason! **Glazes especially are prone to wide fluctuations in color and effect.**

**Ordering and Shipping:**

Due to overwhelming response, I have had to limit custom orders to a few batches a year. Please sign up for my customs newsletter at the top of my website to be notified when I will next be accepting custom orders. I'm sorry for the inconvenience, but I just can't accommodate the large amount of orders I have been receiving, though I am very grateful for my loyal and new customers!

I accept Paypal, Mastercard, Visa, and money orders. Items are packed carefully in layers of corrugated wrap and bubble wrap, and I will quote you a shipping charge after packing and weighing, before your order is finalized. I usually ship by Fedex ground but that is flexible. International shipping is available.

**Butter Crock\***

**\$24.00**

This is an amazing and very old invention. It is dramatically regaining popularity. These crocks hold a stick of butter (1/2 cup). They measure approximately 3 1/2 inches across and 3 inches high. Instructions included. Read more below:

Before the age of refrigeration, butter was often kept in earthenware pots large and small, often submerged in water.

Pack softened butter into the upper cup, then put a 1/2 inch of water into the base. The lid is placed back into the base. The water creates an airtight seal that preserves the freshness of the butter while keeping it at room temperature. Replace the water every couple of days to ensure the butter stays fresh. Crocks keep butter fresh at room temperature (up to about 80° F)\* on the counter for up to a month without spoiling.

\*In hotter weather (85° and up) the butter may slip out.



**Batter Bowl\***

**\$25.00**

Perfect for pancake, brownie and cake batter! These hold slightly less than 2 quarts and have a sturdy handle and spout for pouring. They measure approximately 7 1/2 inches across and 4 1/2 inches high.



### Berry Bowl

\$25.00

These are just the right size to wash and display a quart of berries, cherries or grapes! Also good for draining a single serving of pasta or salad. Comes with a matching saucer to catch drips. Approximately 6 1/2 inches across and 3 1/2 inches high.



### Casserole\*

\$45.00

These are almost non stick inside- a quick swish with a scrub pad and baked on food comes right off! These hold about 3 quarts of food- enough for a crowd.



### Cereal Bowl\*

\$14.00

Pretty self-explanatory. These hold about 2 cups and measure approximately 6 inches across and 2 1/2 inches high.



### Chili and Soup Crock

\$16.00

Individual baking crocks are great for French Onion Soup, individual casserole servings, or just for serving chili or stew. They hold more than 2 cups and have a lug on each side for easy gripping with pot holders.



### Compost Pail

\$36.00

A discreet way to keep your compostables hidden until you can take them out to your compost heap. Also good for numerous other uses. Handle made of coiled copper. These usually must be custom ordered.



### Cookie Jar\*

\$36.00

Large enough to hold a full batch of cookies or a large package of store bought! Glazed clear on the inside.

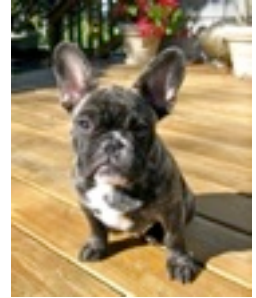


### Dog Treat Jar\*

The sound of the lid being removed brings my Georgie and Russell running! Handle is cast from a real dog biscuit. These hold a regular sized box of dog cookies.

### Fruit bowl\*

\$38.00

These come in so many versions! Some are tall and deep, others low and wide. Many colors available. Please email for availability, photos, or to place an order for something special.



### Fruit bowl, petal shaped

Large bowl with the rim gently turned in at 5 equidistant points, creating a 5 petal flower shape.



### Slip Trailed Serving/fruit Bowl

\$42.00

Large bowl with decorative rim, created by squeezing out lines of liquefied clay (slip) in a pattern.



### Juicer

Old fashioned Juicer in stoneware.



### Mini Bread Baker\*

\$13.00

Use this little pot to bake muffins, breads, and Jiffy mixes! These vary in shape and color. See below for more information, included with your order.

For your favorite muffin recipe, spray baker thoroughly with cooking spray, fill 2/3 full, and bake at temperature specified in recipe for 20-30 minutes or until browned and a pick inserted comes out clean.

For frozen bread dough, spray thoroughly with cooking spray, place ½ loaf of frozen bread dough in baker, let rise. Bake at temperature recommended on dough package for 15-20 minutes, or until brown and loaf sounds hollow when thumped.

For Jiffy mixes (such as cornbread), mix according to directions on label, spray baker thoroughly with cooking spray and bake 20-25 minutes or until a pick inserted comes out clean.

### **Other Uses:**

Small mixing bowl, large ice cream bowl, change bowl, a cachepot for small houseplants, a potpourri bowl, use to float a large blossom in water, or feed a pet.

### Pie Plate\*

**\$25.00**

MMMMM pie! Crusts come out flaky and browned when baked in stoneware. These plates tend to run deep-dish in depth and approximately 10 inches across. They come in plain rim and fluted rim versions, with throwing spirals and without.



### Piggy Bank\*

**\$36.00**

Mellow piggy with a curly tail and cloven hooves.

Her cork nose comes out for easy access to your pennies. She comes in pink and spotty versions and measures approximately 6 1/2 inches from nose to rear, and 6 inches high.



### WTF Piggy Bank\*

**\$36.00**

You'd better watch yourself with this guy! Pig with attitude has a cork for a nose that you can remove to empty him of spare change, if you dare! He comes in pink and spotty versions, and measures approximately 6 1/2 inches from nose to rear, and 7 inches to the top of his ear.



### Place Settings\*

**\$ varies**

These are made to order, so any glaze color or combo can be discussed. Place settings can consist of any combination of pieces of your choice. Sets do not receive a discount, as sets are harder to create than individual pieces- items will vary slightly due to glaze characteristics and due to being handmade.

Dinner plates are about 10 1/2 inches across \$18

Dessert/ sandwich plates are about 8 1/2 inches \$14

### Salt Pygg

**\$20.00**

Comes with a little wood scoop for scooping out salt, but the opening is big enough to reach in and grab a pinch.



### Slip Trailed Platter\*

\$38.00

Platters with a design created by squeezing out lines of liquefied clay (slip). My most popular is the Striper Platter, shown here, with a rope design impressed around the rim.



### Soap/Lotion Dispenser\*

\$18.00

Available in all different shapes and colors. A very approximate 6 inches high not including pump.



### Sugar bowl/honey pot

\$22.00

Approximately 5 inches high, holding approximately 2 cups. Free wood honey dipper included upon request.



### Toothbrush Holder

\$20.00

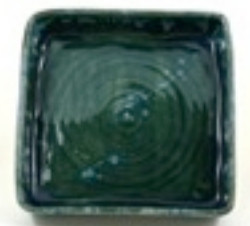
6 3/4" holes for toothbrushes and the tube of toothpaste goes in the center. When it gets dirty you can throw it in the dishwasher. Does NOT fit spin brushes, sorry! Many colors to choose from, matching the soap dispensers.



### Soap Dish/Spoon Rest

\$6.00

Simple, sweet little soap dish or spoon rest, with a swirl of raised clay to keep your soap high and dry. Available in many different colors.



### Square Baking Dish

\$32.00

A useful shape for baking or serving! These can range from 8x8 to 9x9 inches due to difficulty in predicting the final size when altering the original round thrown shape. Approximately 2 inches deep.



Squishy Cup

\$9.00

A fun little cup with no handle, squished to form convenient grooves for your fingers to grasp. These hold approximately 8 ounces and are glazed white on the inside. These usually must be custom ordered.



Teapot \*

\$45.00

Large Teapots hold 1.5 quarts or more. Integrated strainer for loose tea. Some are perched on kitten feet. Handle is cane with rattan binding at the loops. Because of handle, dishwasher and microwave are not recommended. These are not intended for use on top of the stove, but for steeping and serving tea only.



Yarn Bowl

\$20.00

A decorative way to hold balls of yarn while you knit. Plain bowls are \$20, with sheep or second slot \$22. These usually must be custom ordered.



Platters done in Cuerda Seca style\*

\$90.00 and up

These designs are created by drawing thin outlines in a black pigmented wax. The spaces are then filled with a pool of glaze from a syringe. When fired, the wax burns off, leaving a recessed black line, and the glaze forms glassy mounds of color.

These platters measure 15 inches by 11 inches. By special order only.
